# Mum's inspiring story of twins' birth is a blog hit

A MOTHER from Charing is up for a national award for her blog about the experience of giving birth to premature twins

Jennie Nairn, 34, of Old Ashford Road, wrote a diary after the emergency delivery of her babies three months early at Ashford's William Harvey Hospital last July.

After publishing her story about twins William and Esther online, offering advice to others with premature babies, she was nominated for the Mum and Dad (MAD) Blog Awards.

The former Charing Primary School teacher, who lives with fiancee David Henley, said: "I got sick because I had a twisted bowel so had to have an operation. They operated and saved my life and the lives of the babies.

"We were in the neonatal intensive care unit for 59 days. While I was there I wrote a diary in a book and I decided to publish it online to help other people who have had premature babies in special care."

The babies, now 10 months old, are both still small for their age with Esther weighing just 13lb and William at 15lb. The pair are both classed as having chronic


